<b>Goal Criteria - Defined</b>	<b>Extra Tips</b>	<b>My SMART Goal:</b>
<p><b>Specific-</b>A specific goal has a much better chance of getting accomplished than one that is broad &amp; general. Think of this as the who, what, when, where, which, why, and how statements of your ILE.</p>	<p>Use action words such as create, design, build, implement, make, produce, etc. Don't make your goal too complex.</p>	<p><b>Who-</b> Kids unsure about going to Okizu, a camp for kids with cancer and their siblings  <b>What-</b> I will make a video documentary with at least one interview  <b>When-</b> Any time I have available in class and at home between now and the end of the semester  <b>Where-</b> I am going to talk to the staff at Okizu about letting them use it for their website, otherwise it will just be on Youtube.  <b>Which-</b> Helps not just kids, but other people as well, understand Okizu  <b>How-</b> By allowing a few campers share their experiences with Okizu.</p>
<p><b>Measurable-</b> Establish concrete criteria for measuring progress toward the attainment of each goal you set. Ask "how questions" such as How many? How much? How will I know when I have achieved my goals?</p>	<p>Measure the milestones you reach as you work towards your overall project goal. Consider using a some type of progress tracking app or web tool (a Google Sheet is fine), regularly update the ILE section of your personal blog.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Start with research on Okizu</li> <li>-Ask who is willing to answer interview questions on camera with their parent's permission</li> <li>-Start the video of what Okizu is</li> <li>-Film the interviews</li> <li>-Put together all of the film</li> <li>-Edit the video</li> </ul>

<p><b>Attainable-</b> Your ILE project should challenge you, and possibly push your limits, but it should also be a project that you are capable of completing.</p>	<p>Do you have the resources you need to accomplish your ILE? Do you have enough time to accomplish your ILE? Pick an ILE that is important to you. This will make attaining the goal more of a reality versus just a fantasy.</p>	<p>I have a camera, video editing software, and the connections to ask people to be in the interview. It is important to me and I actually really do want to make this video for the benefits of other kids.</p>
<p><b>Realistic, Relevant &amp; Results Oriented-</b> An ILE that you are not only capable of achieving, but willing to achieve, has a much greater chance of getting accomplished.</p>	<p>Are you willing to make the commitment to achieve this goal? Are you willing to make sacrifices in your lifestyle and/or schedule to achieve your ILE? Be honest with yourself, make it relevant to your life. Consider a project that will not only benefit you, but the NHS community.</p>	<p>I will definitely make the commitment to this video. For those who are one edge about attending camp, they can see this video and hopefully realize what it's all about. Then maybe they will decide to go.</p>
<p><b>Timely and/or Tangible-</b> your ILE should have a specific start and end date. It should also result in some type of product you can see or touch (video, demonstration, etc)</p>	<p>Without a clear timeframe for your ILE, there will be sense of urgency and a low level of motivation. Aim to show tangible evidence of the progress you are making every two weeks. You will present the final ILE as part of the mid-term</p>	<p>I will have the video completed before the end of the semester. I should have it done with plenty of time at the end of the semester to be able to incorporate extra features into the video. I can show</p>
